

Sapporo Fujino Outdoor Sports Interaction Facility Terms of Use

Article 1 Scope of Application.

The contract for the use of the ski resort managed by the company is governed by these General Terms and Conditions, and all matters not provided for in these General Terms and Conditions are governed by laws and regulations and the "Snow Sports Safety Standards" and, if not provided for by laws and regulations, by general customs.

Article 2 Inherent dangers of snow sports

All users of this resort (hereinafter referred to as "users") must understand that all snow sports, including skiing and snowboarding, involve inherent dangers.

1. Dangers associated with weather conditions such as snowfall, blizzards, rain, fogs, etc. (including whiteout conditions) .
 2. Hazards associated with the terrain, such as cliffs, slopes, unevenness, ditches, streams, etc.
 3. Hazards due to snow quality and surface conditions such as icy slopes, deep snow, avalanches, etc.
 4. Hazards posed by natural obstacles such as trees, stumps, bushes, rocks, and exposed ground.
 5. Collisions with man-made structures such as lift posts, signs, ropes, mats, etc.
 6. Collision with snow vehicles.
 7. Hazards associated with the use of snow parks, etc.
 8. Danger due to excessive speed.
 9. Danger from self-inflicted falls.
 10. Risk of collision with other users.
 11. Fatigue, alcohol, medication and poor physical condition.
 12. Hazards due to improper use of equipment.
 13. Other similar hazards.

Article 3 Observance of signs and instructions

The users are obliged to follow all signs, instructions, announcements, warnings on the course map and the instructions of the staff of the resort, including the patrols.

Article 4 Prohibited actions

The following actions are forbidden to users.

1. Entering and skiing outside the controlled area/non-skiing area (including outside the net/rope area) * Hereinafter referred to as "No Trespassing Area".
2. Entering and skiing in the closed course.
3. Intentionally skiing in close proximity to other users or man-made or natural objects such as standing trees, lift poles, etc.
4. Interfering with the operation of the ski lift.
5. Approaching any snow vehicle.
6. Skiing under the influence of alcohol or drugs, or in a state of mental or physical incapacity.
7. Climbing the slopes for the purpose of mountaineering, etc.
8. Unauthorized resale of lift tickets.
9. Standing or sitting in the course for an extended period of time.
10. Monopolizing or occupying the slopes by creating aerial platforms or kickers, setting up poles, etc. without authorization.
11. Selling goods or holding events in the resort without the resort's permission.
12. Flying a drone without the resort's permission.
13. Throwing or leaving empty cans, garbage or other objects outside the designated areas.
14. Smoking in the resort.
15. Letting dogs or other animals on the slopes.
16. Destroying the nature of the mountain.
17. Other similar acts.

Article 5 Duty to slow down

Users shall slowdown in the following circumstances.

1. When there is a sign for slow traffic.
2. When the terrain or obstacles make it difficult to see ahead.
3. When there is insufficient snow cover at the beginning of the season or in early spring.
4. When visibility is poor due to snowfall, blizzard, dense fog, sunset, etc. (including whiteout)
5. When approaching natural obstacles such as standing trees or man-made structures such as lift posts, nets, ropes, etc.
6. At course merging points or when the course is narrow.

7. When approaching a lift station or descent point.
 8. When the course is crowded.
 9. When approaching patrols or snowmobiles on duty.
 10. When skiing where it can be dangerous unless slowed down.

Article 6 Obligations when skiing

Users are obliged to ski in accordance with the following points.

1. Control their speed according to the terrain, the climate, the quality of the snow, their ability and the crowd on the slopes.
 2. Give priority to skiers on the upper side of the slope when starting, joining or crossing the slope.
 3. Watch the skiers in front of you and keep a safe distance from them while skiing.
 4. When overtaking, leave enough space to allow for unexpected movements of the person being overtaken.
 5. In the event of a fall, clear the track as quickly as possible and move to the side of the track.
 6. Use the edge of the trail when stopping, climbing, or descending.
 7. Do not sit on the track or stop in narrow areas or areas with poor visibility.
 8. When patrols or snow vehicles are on duty, give priority to their duties and operations and stop or slow down to make way for them.
 9. Attach a brake or a leash cord to your equipment to prevent it from sliding down and injuring other users.

Article 7 Obligations in the use of the park Area

Users must respect the following points.

1. Ski within the limits of their own abilities and skills.
 2. Check the safety of the area around the landing point before starting.
 3. Wear a helmet and other necessary protective equipment.
 4. Obey all warning signs on the notice boards, etc.

Article 8 Use by groups or organizations

1. If you wish to use the ski resort in a group of 10 or more people, the representative must notify us in advance.
2. The representative of the group or organization shall take the initiative to comply with these Terms and Conditions and shall ensure that other users comply with these Terms and Conditions.

Article 9 Teaching activities in our resort

1. Any person who gives instruction in skiing, snowboarding or other snow sports in this resort (hereinafter referred to as "instructor") must notify this us in advance. However, this does not apply to advice or instruction between family members or friends.
2. Instructors may not conduct instructional activities in a location or in a manner that interferes with other users.
3. Instructors shall provide thorough safety instructions to students, taking into consideration weather, snow conditions, course conditions, and other factors, and shall provide instruction appropriate to the skill level of the students.
4. Instructors must ensure that students comply with these Terms of Use.
5. The resort is not responsible for any accidents or problems that may occur during the lesson activities. Please cope with any accidents or problems during lesson activities by yourself.

Article 10 Obligations of Guardians and Attendants of Children

1. Parents/guardians/accompanying persons must assess the child's ability and ensure that the child is not put in danger.
2. Parents/guardians/ accompanying persons should endeavor to teach the child about the matters specified in these Terms and Conditions.

Article 11 Cooperation in the event of an accident

1. Witnesses and other people involved in an accident must immediately report the accident to the patrol and other members of our ski area staff. In some cases, first aid will be requested.
2. In the event of an accident, all users are requested to make every effort to rescue the injured.
3. All parties and witnesses to an accident must mutually identify themselves.
4. In the event of an accident, all users, whether parties to the accident or witnesses, must accurately report the circumstances of the accident, as well as their names and contact information, when requested by our resort personnel.

Article 12 Safety Equipment

Users are encouraged to make every effort to wear safety equipment such as a helmet.

Article 13 Insurance Recommendations

Users are encouraged to buy an insurance in case of accidents.

Article 14 Rescue operations in restricted areas

In the event that a user enters a restricted area and is injured or lost, the resort will not assume any responsibility and will not conduct search and rescue operations at the user's request. In the event that the resort conducts rescue operations in the restricted area at the request of the police, fire department, or other government agencies, the following fees will be charged to the user.

In addition, if the Resort suffers any damage as a result of the rescue operation, the User will also be charged for such damage.

Personnel expenses will be added at the following rates according to the time spent on rescue activities.

*Labor costs will be added according to the time spent on rescue activities at the following rates.

From 5:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. 25%

From 10:00 p.m. to 10:00 a.m. 50%

Article 15 Claims for Damages

In the event that we suffer damages due to the intentional or negligent act of a user, or due to the user's failure to comply with laws and regulations or the provisions of these Terms and Conditions, we shall be entitled to claim such damages from the user.

Article 16 Refusal of use

We will refuse the use of the ski area, after having suspended the use of the lift tickets, in any of the following cases.

1. When the resort considers that the use of the resort is not in accordance with these conditions, or that there is the possibility of this happening.
2. When a user asks for excessive services that are not normally provided by the resort.

3. If the use of the resort is contrary to the provisions of laws and regulations, public order or good morals.
 4. In case it is considered unsafe to use the resort because of intoxication, etc.
 5. In case of natural disasters, epidemics or other unavoidable reasons that prevent the use of the resort.
 6. When a user fails to comply with the instructions of the Company's personnel, such as patrols.
 7. If the user is or may be a member of a designated organized crime group, or an antisocial group according to the "Law for the Prevention of Unjust Acts by Organized Crime Groups".
 8. If there is a justifiable reason other than those listed in the preceding items.

Article 17 Restrictions on use

We may restrict the use of all or part of the resort when weather conditions, epidemics or other unavoidable circumstances affect the safety of the resort.

Article 18 Modification of conditions

These General Terms and Conditions are subject to change depending on the historical background and environment.

The fact that changes will be made, the content of the amended conditions and the date of entry into force of the changes will be announced on the Internet or by other appropriate means at the time of entry into force of the changes.

(Supplementary Provisions) Effective Date and Enforcement

These Terms and Conditions shall enter into force on November 1, 2024.
